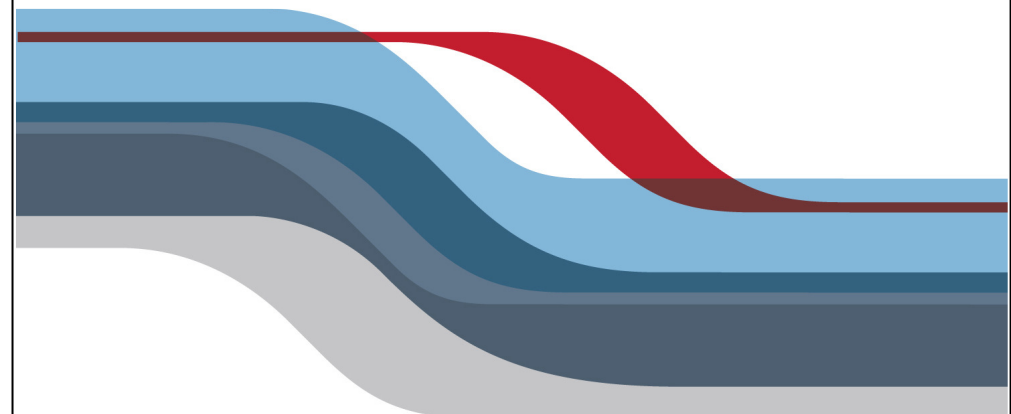

What is an Apprenticeship?

An Apprenticeship is a training programme that combines real employment with a recognised qualification.

This qualification meets the needs of those who work or want to work in a wide range of children and young people's settings. This could be in daycare, crèches, schools, pre-School/playgroups, child minder's own homes, children's centers or home childcare or hospitals.

The level 2 certificate is suitable for candidates working under supervision, such as a Nursery Assistant or Playgroup Assistant working with children under five, or an Assistant Play worker in an out of school setting.



Apprenticeship Framework

There are a number of elements to each Apprenticeship. This Apprenticeship framework has 2 main strands:

Competence Based Element	Key or Functional Skills
Level 2 QCF Certificate in Children & Young People's Workforce	English Level 1 Maths Level 1

There is no knowledge based requirement as the level 2 certificate is a combined knowledge and competence qualification

Course Duration

This Apprenticeship has a framework that has been developed specially for the Children & Young People's Workforce. The course will last a minimum of **12 months**.

Delivery and Costs

To enter onto an Apprenticeship you must be employed for a minimum of 16 hours per week. During your Apprenticeship you will spend one day per week in the college. Workshop sessions and key skills are taught on college days. A tutor will visit you in your workplace at agreed times to observe your practical work and put together the portfolio needed for your qualification.

The training is free to Apprentices. As a full time employee you will receive your normal salary. Your employer will agree to release you for your college commitments at the scheduled times.

Course Content

To achieve the Level 2, candidates must achieve 31 credits from the mandatory units and a minimum of 4 credits from the optional units available.

Mandatory Units:

- Introduction to Communication in Children and Young People's settings.
- Introduction to Personal Development in Children and Young people's settings.
- Introduction to Equality and Inclusion in Children and Young People's settings.
- Child and Young Person development.
- Contribute to the Support of Children and Young people's development.
- Safeguarding the Welfare of Children and Young People.
- Contribute to Children and Young People's Health and Safety.
- Support Children and Young People's Positive Behavior.
- Contribute to the Support of Positive Environments for Children and Young People.
- Understand partnership working in services for Children and Young People.
- Maintain and Support relationships with Children and Young People.
- Pediatric Emergency First Aid.
- Managing Pediatric Illness and Injury.

Optional Units (the following is just a few of the available units)

- Support Children and Young People with Disabilities, Special and Educational needs.
- Understanding Child and Young Person Development.
- Understand the needs of Children and Young People who are vulnerable and experiencing poverty and disadvantage.
- Support the Creativity of Children and Young People.
- Introduction to the Duty of Care in Children and Young People's settings.
- Understand how to Support Positive outcomes for Children and Young People.
