

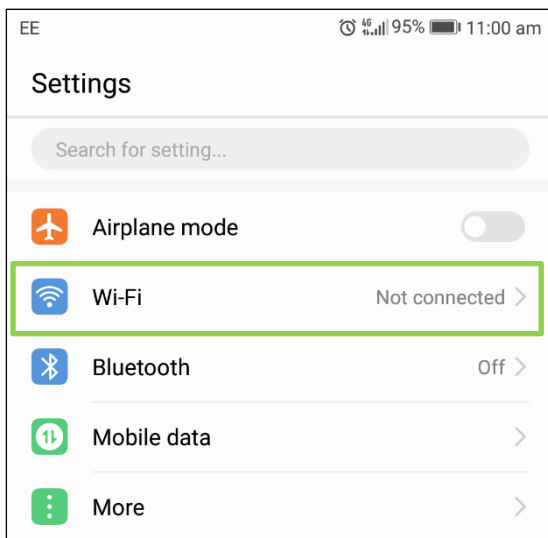
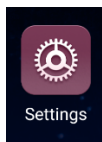


## Connecting Mobile Android Device to eduroam Wi-Fi

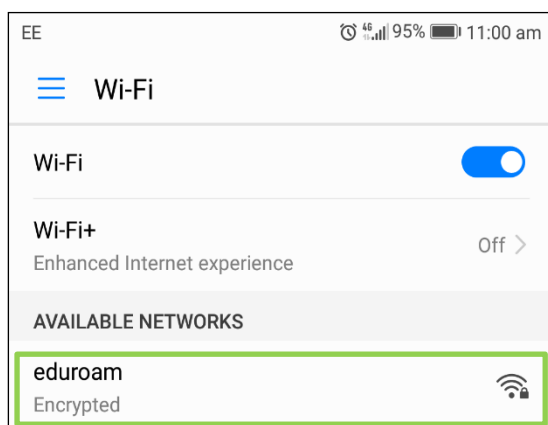
Below are instructions on how to connect your mobile Android device to the eduroam wireless network. There are different versions of Android available, but the wireless instructions are similar on all the current releases.

**Please note: that some mobile phone vendors have removed some options and protocols from their devices which results in them not being configurable for eduroam. If you cannot see the options described on this page, your device may not work with eduroam.**

1. Open Settings / Wi-Fi and turn Wi-Fi on



2. Now click on eduroam and connect.





3. Set the "EAP method" type to "PEAP"
4. Set the "Phase-2 authentication" to "MSCHAPv2"
5. Set the "CA certificate" to "Do not validate"
6. In the "Identity" field, enter your **Username@your-realm.ac.uk** (this is your college/university email address) (do not enter anything in the 'Anonymous identity' field).

If you are a member of **staff** at South Thames College or Merton College your username will be: **firstname.lastname@south-thames.ac.uk** (please **do not** use @stcg.ac.uk, this does not yet work).

If you are a **student** at South Thames College or Merton College your username will be: **studentID@student.south-thames.ac.uk**

If you are employed/attend any other college/university with a **.ac.uk** address, please use those details.

7. Now enter your college/university **password**
8. Then click on "**connect**".

9. You should now see the eduroam status change to first "Obtaining IP address" and then "connected".

10. You are now **connected**.

**Please note: When your college/university password expires you will need to change your password on a PC at your college/university. You will then have to re-enter the new password into the eduroam Wi-Fi settings and click connect again.**
